The vision of the projects

Vidnova aimed to rehabilitate a community that had survived Russian occupation, addressing complex needs for physical recovery, economic growth, social cohesion, and environmental security.

The purpose was to stimulate community recovery through an integrated approach covering physical infrastructure restoration, economic resuscitation, restoration of social ties, and environmental sustainability. The project aimed to activate community participation in the recovery process, increasing stability and self-sufficiency.

All participants have different backgrounds, which allows them to comprehensively implement educational and cultural projects. 
